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#### **NPKUA**

The nation organization has hit the ground running with lots of wonderful ventures and events underway.

### Membership:

As of right now only state or regional organizations can be active members in the National PKU Alliance. The following state organizations are currently member of the NPKUA; Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Texas, Minnesota, California, Florida, The New England connection which includes MA, RI, VT, NH, ME, CT and MACPAD (The Mid-Atlantic Connection for PKU and Allied Disorders) which includes PA, DE, MD, OH, NJ, NY, CT. Michigan and Iowa have submitted their applications for NPKUA and local organizations in Florida, Utah, and Wyoming have recently received their 501(c)(3) status and have expressed they will be submitting membership applications to the NPKUA soon. Individuals and Clinics who wish to join NPKUA can do so soon, membership program push will within the next month. Membership applications will be available online, and made available through participating clinics and the PKU News. Check the www.NPKUA.org website for undated information. ### National Meeting Scheduled:

"High Hopes" is the first ever national PKU conference that will be at the Embassy Suites South Hotel in Dallas, on January 15-17, 2010. The conference will have speakers as well as entertainment. More information will be posted in the press as the conference takes shape.

#### National Interest:

The national organization is in the works of putting together a public service announcement to attract the estimated 5,000 individuals with PKU currently not being seen at clinic or on diet, and encourage them to visit a clinic and return to diet. The PSA will be aired mid may hoping to reach all 50 states. Research is underway evaluating which states provide food and formula coverage. Efforts are being made to help all PKU patients, at every age. Research continues on national and state coverage for medical foods and formula, and for newborn screening. Summaries have been compiled on all 50 states, with additional research into coverage in Texas, Virginia, Wyoming, Kansas, D.C., Georgia and Oregon. The Advocacy Committee has determined that TX has comparatively good fomula coverage, but lacks medical food coverage. D.C., Virginia, and Georgia have little or no food or formula provisions. Wyoming, Kansas and Oregon have pending legislation.

#### New Director Hired:

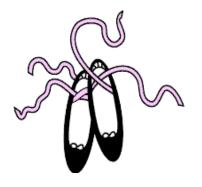

Christine lives in northern Wisconsin in a small town of 3,700 called Tomahawk. She is married to a professional chef, Kevin, (which comes in handy with PKU cooking) and has three boys – Keagan 6, Connor 3 and Kellen 1. Both Connor and Kellen have PKU.

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## Who's Who in PKU Illinois Summer 2009 Profile

Talli is a thrilled-seeking social butterfly. She will turn 8 years old in October and she is just finishing up the 1st grade. She is mainstreamed in our local elementary school with resource support, speech and OT. She participates in jazz and ballet and Daisy Scouts. She LOVES to build with Legos, take things apart, play with her friends, and visit Disney World. Her favorite rides are the Tower of Terror, Splash Mountain, Space Mountain and Journey to Atlantis at Sea World.

She was diagnosed with Propionic Acidemia from newborn screening, although she was well into her first crisis situation when we received the results of her testing. She spent nearly a month at CHoP to stabilize her and get her diet just right. She has had over 20 hospitalizations because of illness. For the past 3 years, she has had received IV immuglobulins every four weeks. She is unable to have the infusion run quickly, so she always has an overnight stay in the hospital. We attempted to have her use a port-a-cath, but after a year of no problems she had two episodes of sepsis, the last one being fungal and bacterial. She has other health challenges that have made it difficult to keep her stable all of the time and also just adds to her complexity. She has Long QT Syndrome, hypothyroidism, allergies, asthma, esophagitis, GERD, secondary immunodeficiency, and occasionally, she has neutropenia, low platelets, and anemia. She has a history of sleep apnea, is on her 4th set of ear tubes, has had her tonsils removed once and her adenoids twice.

### **NETWORK PKU CONFERENCE 2009**

I had the pleasure of being invited to this meeting on April 24th-26th in Denver, Colorado. The meeting was a collaboration between Applied Nutrition Corp, Biomarin Pharmaceutical Inc., The Children's Hospital in Denver, and Johnson and Wales University (JWU).

The weekend program was filled with educational and culinary workshops to increase attendees' knowledge about PKU and Low Protein Cooking. All teenagers and adults with PKU and other interested metabolic disorders patients who follow a protein restricted diet and their families were divided into concurrent workshop groups along with some joint general sessions. These included: a talk on "Research in PKU Drug Therapy" given by Elaina Jurecki, MS, RD, nutrition specialist from Biomarin who was the keynote speaker at the 2008 annual meeting; "Healthy Choices and More Phe" given by Laurie Bernstein, MS, RD, The Children's Hospital, and "Transitioning Teens to Adult PKU Management" presented by Sandy Simons, MA, RD from Applied Nutrition.

All of the sessions were held at Johnson and Wales University which is renowned for being one of the best degree culinary institutions. The attendees were divided into different themed groups, and I was in the Miami Beach group where I met several families from across the country. One family was from Dubuque, Iowa and has attended the annual IL meeting in the past with their grandparents who brought them to Denver. These workshops were in the culinary labs and conducted by the JWU chefs who had developed the theme recipes which were submitted ahead to the Children's Hospital dietitians for phe content approval. These sessions which provided printed recipes, demonstrations, and tasting samples included: Cold Soups and Summer Delights, Super Summer Salads, Spicing up your Barb-B-Que (given by Malathy Ramanujam, Taste Connections, who also has spoken and demonstrated at a previous annual meeting and given a cooking class at UIC), Summer Desserts, and a hands on DNA Extraction we did with a discussion on "Do You Know Your Genes from your DNA?" given by genetic counselors from Children's Hospital. I have several recipes to share- two that I have that I since tried at home: one from Malathy's barbeque demo (Best Un "Beetable" Burgers which has only 25 mg phe,) and a Brussels Sprout Slaw recipe (36 mg phe). I am going to share both with you, and want to stress that if you don't like beets or brussel sprouts, you won't really taste them in the recipe. They do require a food processor, but as parents when you are preparing recipes, it helps to make several items in a food processor at the same time before packing it all away, since this is more time efficient with our busy life style. I also have a good nutritious recipe, Roasted Sweet Potato and Apple Soup, to share with you that has 30 mg phe per serving. If anyone would like any of the other recipes, please contact me at 312-996-9283.

The return of the Iron Chef America-PKU Low Protein Cooking Challenge was a big success. The secret ingredient was an Apple that had to be used in 3 recipes- appetizer, entrée, and dessert. Each group of 2 sections had one hour to create a recipe from a list of ingredients that were available, write up the recipe, and calculate the phe content per serving, and present it to the chefs for judging. The dietitians were there as supervisor/assistants but not as the "hands-on" creative patients. Family members were not allowed to be in the Iron Chef competition. They were in the session presented by Sandy Simons. There was also an excellent presentation from the director of nutrition from Applied Nutrition, Bridget Wardley, MS, RD, who discussed the nutrition essentials in the PKU diet along with the opportunity to taste test several of the Applied Nutrition products along with various flavorings.

Pam Kowalczyk, daughter of Linda and Jim, one of our own CMH patients from Illinois was there with her boyfriend. She has graduated from college and is currently an elementary teacher in Dubuque, Iowa. She presented the recipes for her group to the judges, and they won the overall Iron Chef competition for 2 out of the 3 categories. Michelle is pictured here with her presentation to the audience.

This was a great event for meeting other families and learning about making low protein foods both palatable and nutritious. This culinary program is usually offered every few years, and would be highly recommended as a "Top Chef" Educational program.

### Recipes from the Event

### Roasted Sweet Potato and Apple Soup

Yield: 8 servings Serving Size: 5oz Protein: 0.72g PHE: 30.1mg

### INGREDIENTS:

1 ½ cup Sweet Potatoes cubed

1 cup Red Apple, peeled, cored and sliced

1 cup Onion, chopped

3 cloves Garlic 2 tablespoons Olive Oil 4 cups Water

To taste Salt and Pepper

### METHOD OF PREPARATION

Preheat Oven to 450 degrees F. Place sweet potatoes, apple, onion and garlic in roasting pan and toss them with oil. Roast uncovered until soft. Transfer roasted vegetables to blender or food processor and pour in enough water to cover them. Add pinch of salt and pepper, then puree. Thin as needed with water. Return to heat to warm and serve.

### Brussels Sprout Slaw

Yield: 8 servings Serving Size: ½ cup Protein: 1.11g

PHE: 35.6mg

### INGREDIENTS:

1 cup Brussels Sprouts, shredded 1 cup Red Cabbage, shredded

1 cup Carrots, Grated 1 cup Dates, chopped

#### METHOD OF PREPARATION

Combine all ingredients, season with salt and pepper, marinate for 2 hours.

### Best Un "Beetable" Burgers

Yield: 4-6 servings Serving Size: 1 burger

If recipe makes 4 burgers Protein: 0.85g PHE: 24.8mg
If recipe makes 5 burgers Protein 0.70g PHE: 19.8mg
If recipe makes 6 burgers Protein 0.56g PHE: 16.5 mg

#### INGREDIENTS:

2 tablespoon Raw Beets, grated finely

½ small Zucchini, grated

½ small Carrot, peeled and grated

1 medium Granny Smith apple, peeled and grated

1/4 medium Red onion, minced
 1 teaspoon Fresh Garlic, minced
 1 tablespoon Tomato ketchup
 2 tablespoons BBQ Sauce
 1/4 teaspoon Liquid Smoke

3 tablespoons Canola Oil

½ cup Low protein bread crumbs (made from 2 slices of dried low-protein bread)

1/4 cup Taste Connections Multi Baking Mix

To taste Salt and Pepper

#### METHOD OF PREPARATION

Squeeze out excess moisture from grated vegetables. In food processor or big bowl blend onions, garlic, ketchup, bbq sauce, salt, pepper and canola oil until smooth. Add to grated mixture. Add bread crumbs and TC-Multi Baking Mix to bowl with vegetables. Mix thoroughly until everything is blended well. Refrigerate for one hour. With wet hands, shape into 4-6 burgers. Cook 3 minutes on each side on grill lightly brushed with oil.

A student may win more than once, but not in consecutive years.

### **Guidelines:**

The applicant must submit a complete application and,

- Show proof that he/she will be enrolled in classes during the school year for which the scholarship is being awarded
- ➤ Have been diagnosed with PKU or an Allied Disorder
- > Show proof of primary residence in Illinois
- Submit a short essay
- ➤ Will apply scholarship funds to College/University/Vocational school expenses (i.e. course fees, textbooks, room & board)
