### Research project update Spring 2007

"Phenylalanine-free Protein Produced in Genetically Engineered Soybean"; Harold Trick, Department of Plant Pathology, *Kansas State University* (2/28/07)

One of the projects in my laboratory is to produce a phenylalanine (PHE)-free protein in transgenic soybean as a source of dietary protein free of phenylalanine. This project is partially funded through MACPAD and the PKU Organization of Illinois and I would like to give a short update of our progress for the last six months.

Several individual plants from four 1st generation transgenic soybean lines have been grown in the greenhouse to establish homozygous lines, for progeny analysis, and for seed increase. Two of these lines contain the native gamma zein gene and two lines contain the PHE-free gamma zein gene. Molecular analysis was performed on these plants where DNA was extracted and the polymerase chain reaction (PCR) helped segregate the plants which contain the transgenes. Individual plants that tested positive for the selection gene and the gamma zein gene were maintained to the greenhouse for seed collection. Many of these plants are currently close to maturity and will be harvested later this spring. In addition, immature seeds were harvested from each line and PCR analysis was used to identify the homozygous plants. Immature seeds were also taken from these plants and protein was extracted for western blot analysis. Both the native gamma zein and PHE-free lines appear to be expressing the transgenic protein and homozygous plants from each of the transgenic lines have been identified.

Mature seeds from each of these plants will be used for additional seed increase, for amino acid analysis, and to begin the refinement of our protein extraction procedures. We anticipate performing amino acid analysis on the mature seeds as well as refining our extraction techniques of the zein protein from endogenous soybean protein later this spring into the summer. A notification to Biotechnology Regulatory Services (the office of USDA which implements the regulations for genetically engineered organisms) was sent informing them we intend to increase these lines in the field this summer. (This step is necessary to comply with federal regulations concerning field testing of transgenic crops.) By increasing seeds in the field we will be able to increase to amount of seed in greater amounts than just growing in the greenhouse.

Rabbit polyclonal antibodies have been made to the gamma zein protein to aid in the detection of the protein as we refine the extraction methods. This antibody reacts to both the native gamma zein as well as the modified PHE-free gamma zein.

Seven new transformation experiments were also initiated in the fall of 2006. The purpose for these experiments is to create additional lines which may boost the amount of PHE-free zein protein in the soybean seed. Two different versions of the modified PHE-free protein were used in these transformations with one containing an additional DNA sequence which will facilitates protein extraction from the seed. Currently these cultures are under selection.

### A quick reminder...

The Andrew Craig Scholarship Application Process has begun for 2007!

This year the PKU Organization of Illinois will again award scholarships to qualifying individuals with PKU or an Allied Disorder. Qualifying individuals must:

- 1. have been diagnosed with PKU or Allied Disorder; and
  - 2. be a resident of Illinois; and
- 3. be enrolled in an accredited college, university, or vocational school in the fall of 2007; and
- 4. not have been awarded a 2006 Andrew Craig Scholarship (Individuals may win more than once, but not in consecutive years); and
- 5. submit a complete application by August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2007.

All applications will be reviewed by the Board of Directors of the PKU Organization of Illinois, and winners will be selected. All winners will be notified by mail, and invited to the PKU Organization of Illinois Annual Meeting on November 3rd, 2007 to be formally recognized by the Board of Directors and the PKU/Allied Disorder community at large.

### May is the 2nd National PKU Awareness Month

Continuing from last year, The Mid-Atlantic Connection for PKU and Allied Disorders, Inc. (MACPAD), has decided to promote May as National PKU Awareness Month. Their website, <a href="http://www.macpad.org">http://www.macpad.org</a>, states "our vision is to have all PKU groups, plan and execute an event during that month that would increase awareness of PKU, while also raising money for research."

In honor of the 2nd Annual PKU Awareness Month, we have decided to do a Walk-A-Thon! On May 20, 2007 individuals with PKU, along with their family are invited to enjoy a fun-filled day at Busse Woods in Elk Grove Village. Registration will begin at 10:30 and the walk is scheduled to end by 12:00. ### NEWBORN SCREENING PROCESS DATA 2005 FROM THE GENETIC AND MEABOLIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Often times we get asked "how many new PKU kids are born in Illinois." Well, the Illinois Department of Public Health maintains a lot of records on all newborn screening that you may find interesting.

Data for the calender year 2005 has just been released, which tells the number of cases for each disorder, the elapsed time from birth to diagnosis using by newborn screening, and other nice to know information, and is summarized below:

During 2005, from birth to diagnosis of PKU, took 14 days; it took 53 days for Fatty Acid Oxidation, and 82 days for Organic Acid. While I do not have the information from 2004, the summary note from IDPH indicated the time was slightly greater in 2005. For just about all of the allied disorders (including PKU), it takes slightly longer than one day from the time IDPH receives the blood sample until the doctor is notified.

In 2005 it took 6.6 days from the time the doctor was notified to final diagnosis--other amino acid disorders were only 3.3 days, and other allied disorders were over 45 days.

There were 27 diagnosed cases of PKU, 31 diagnosed cases of Fatty Acid Oxidation, and 6 diagnosed cases of Organic Acid. For PKU, it is interesting to note that 3 of the 27 cases were reevaluated, and found to be normal; but, 1 of the cases "refused follow-up."

All Classical PKU cases received treatment within 10 days--hyperphe's took slightly longer. As a member of this committee, I am also involved in sub-committees on the development and standardization of educational materials available immediately at diagnosis for the the families. Our committee only meets 2 times per year. However, you would be very impressed with the depth of this committee and the action that takes place as some of the key pulse points of newborn screening are analyzed.
